Fee remission

Fees may be remitted if you are studying a course below a Level 3 and in receipt of a means tested benefit OR you have a household income of less than £25,000 net OR you are employed and earning less than £17,004.00 gross. 5 Accessing financial support for your studies

You can complete an application through your online college account. You will be sent an email with information on how to log on if you haven't done this before.

We can only accept applications that have been completed in full, with the required evidence. You can call us on 0115 9100 100 or email us on studentfinanceall@nottinghamcollege.ac.uk if you require any further support with completing this form.

To be eligible for financial support you must be:

- Enrolled on a current course that qualifies for student funding
- Settled in the UK or an EU National
- Claiming a means tested benefit or on a low income
- Aged 19 years and over and living with parents/guardians and your own income is more than £5000 net or evidence of household income below £25,000 net
- Aged 19 years and over with a household income below £25,000 net

Please Note: If you are studying a full cost course you will not be eligible for student finance support.

What can our student finance support help with?

- A contribution towards your travel if you live more than 1.5 miles away from your place of study
- Essential equipment – this will be confirmed by your tutor at the start of the academic year
- A contribution towards your childcare costs for students aged 20 years and over
- Fees for students aged 19 years and over, studying a co-funded course up to Level 2 with a household income of between £17,004.00 and £25,000 NET

Evidence you will need to supply to support your application

- If you are in receipt of Working Tax Credit or Child Tax Credit please provide all pages of your award notice for 2020/21
- If you are working we will require two months or 8 weeks of payslips
- If you are unemployed we will require proof of evidence for ESA, Income support, JSA, Universal Credit or Pension Guarantee Credit dated within 3 months of your enrolment
- If you are an asylum seeker please provide your AZURE/Aspen Card, compass contract, G4S letter/Home office documents and ARC identity card

If your application is unsuccessful you may complete an appeals form and you will need to provide evidence to support this appeal. If you have had a successful appeal in previous years you may not automatically be approved in subsequent years.

COVID-19
