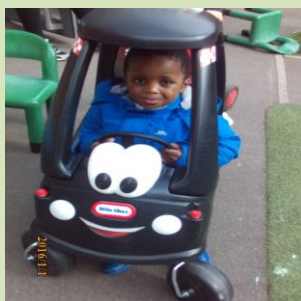
Our learning journey

Local Authority Free Entitlement Hours for 2, 3 and 4 year old eligible children

The 15 and 30 free entitlement hours are available for all **eligible children** to attend an early years setting and regular attendance is expected in order that children make the best start to their education. Your child benefits by being in a learning environment and sharing many fun opportunities and experiences with children of a similar age. These firm foundations help to give your child the best start in their learning journey.

It is a requirement of being in receipt of a funded place that a child's attendance does not fall below 80% for the term, as stated on the Parent Agreement.

If your child is failing to attend nursery to use their free hours, please make contact with the nursery manager to discuss how your child's attendance will improve or to enquire if a funded place is available on a day/time that is more suitable to your family needs.
